

01st of Feb, 2025







AMAZING FACTS ABOUT THE FAMOUS MONUMENTS IN INDIA

India is home to many incredible historical monuments that showcase its rich heritage and architectural brilliance. These monuments, built by different dynasties and rulers, have fascinating facts that make them unique. Let's explore...

FACT 1:

Taj Mahal – Changing Colours The Taj Mahal appears to change colour throughout the day pinkish in the morning, dazzling white at noon, and golden at night due to the reflection of sunlight and moonlight on its white marble.

FACT 2:

Qutub Minar – Tallest Brick Minaret The Qutub Minar in Delhi is the world's tallest brick minaret, standing at 72.5 meters (237.8 feet). It was built by Qutb-ud-din Aibak in 1193 and completed by Iltutmish.

FACT 3:

Hampi – The Forgotten Empire Hampi, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, was once the capital of the Vijayanagara Empire. It had markets where diamonds were freely traded on the streets!

FACT 4:

Charminar – Secret Tunnel Legend Charminar in Hyderabad is believed to have a secret underground tunnel leading to Golconda Fort, used by royal families to escape during emergencies.

FACT 5:

Konark Sun Temple – Engineering Marvel The Konark Sun Temple in Odisha was built in the form of a massive chariot with 24 intricately carved wheels, each functioning as a sundial to tell time accurately.

FACT 6:

Meenakshi Temple – Musical Pillars The Meenakshi Temple in Tamil Nadu has musical pillars that produce different musical notes when tapped!

FACT 7:

Mysore Palace – Grand Illumination The Mysore Palace lights up with nearly 100,000 bulbs on special occasions, creating a breathtaking visual treat.

HISTORIC DOLPHIN TAGGING IN ASSAM

India has achieved a significant milestone in wildlife conservation with the first ever satellite tagging of a Ganges River Dolphin (Platanista gangetica) in Assam. This is a collaborative effort conducted by MOEFCC in partnership with the Wildlife Institute of India, Assam Forest Department and Aaranayak. The Objective of Tagging is to gather critical data on habitat needs, seasonal migratory patterns, and range of the species. Advanced Technology in Tagging Lightweight satellite tags compatible with Argos systems are used. Declared as India's National Aquatic Animal, these dolphins are apex predators and serve as umbrella species for river ecosystems. Nearly blind, they rely on echolocation for navigation and feeding. Ecological impact of protecting river dolphins for aquatic biodiversity and human livelihoods has become essential. In Future, the tagging initiative will be extended to other states within the dolphin's range.


